You don't have to be good, we will be playing in the B division of the Southern Orange County Dart league. We have Tim Curtin bartending Monday night football and good friendship.

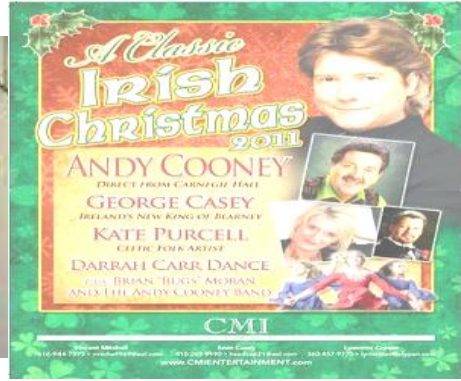

HISTORY

James J. Braddock

James Walter “the Cinderella Man” Braddock (June 7, 1905-November 29, 1974) was an Irish American boxer who was the world heavyweight champion from 1935-1937.

Fighting under the name of James J. Braddock he was known for his powerful right hand, granite chin and his amazing comeback from a floundering career, which saw him lose several bouts before struggling to support his family by working on the docks during the Great Depression and earned him the nickname

“The Cinderella Man” from Damon Runyon. Braddock was managed by Joe Gould.

Braddock was born in Hell’s Kitchen in New York City on West 48th Street which was a few blocks from Madison Square Garden. Braddock pursued boxing turning pro at age 21 fighting as a light heavyweight. After three years his record was 44-2-2 with 21 knockouts. In 1929 he earned a chance to fight for the championship against Tommy Loughran. He lost narrowly in a 15 round decision. Braddock badly fractured his right hand in the bout and his career suffered as a result. His record for the next 33 fights fell to 11-20-2. With his family in poverty during the Great Depression, Braddock had to give up boxing for a little while and worked as a longshoreman. Due to the injuries to his right hand, Braddock compensated by using his left hand during his longshoreman work, and it gradually became stronger than his right hand. During this time he had to accept relief money from the government. After his boxing comeback Braddock returned the welfare money he had received and was inspired by the Catholic Worker Movement, a Christian social justice organization founded by Dorothy Day and Peter Maurin in 1933 to help the homeless and hungry. He made frequent donations to various Catholic Worker Houses including feeding the hungry at his home with his family.

Braddock was hand-picked by Max Baer’s handlers because he was seen as an easy payday for the champion. On June 13, 1935 at Madison Square Garden Braddock won the Heavyweight Championship of the World as the 10-1 underdog in one of the most stunning upsets in boxing history. During the fight, Braddock took a few heavy hits from the powerful younger champion but Braddock kept coming, wearing down Baer. The judges gave Braddock the title in a unanimous decision.

On June 22, 1937 he lost to Joe Louis, Joe Louis was quoted as saying the Braddock was the bravest man he ever fought.

Braddock was inducted into the International Boxing Hall of Fame in 2001.

In 2005 a biographical film Cinderella Man tells the story of James J. Braddock.

Some of his other nicknames were Bulldog of Bergen, Pride of the Irish, Pride of New Jersey.

Braddock’s boxing record was 86 fights 51 wins 26 of which were by KO’s.
