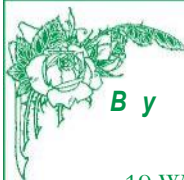

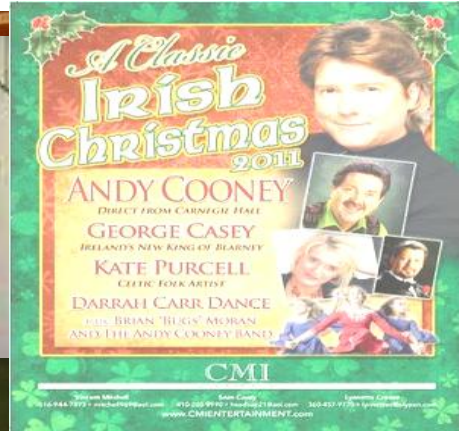

Michael J. Quill (1905-1966)

Quill was born in Gortloughera, near Kilgarvan, County Kerry. He was a dispatch rider for the Irish Republican Army from 1919-1921 while still a teenager; then a member of the IRA itself in the Irish Civil War that followed. One unsubstantiated story has him robbing a bank to raise funds for the IRA. Quill worked as a carpenter's apprentice, then a woodcutter after the end of the Civil War. He was brought to the United States in 1926 by his uncle Patrick Quill who was a conductor in the subway and got him his first job. Quill's IRA record of service was confirmed by his commanding officer John Joe Rice, Kerry 2nd Brigade years later to Quill's widow Shirley.

Mike Quill was one of the founders of the Transport Workers Union of America (TWU) a union founded by the subway workers in New York City that expanded to represent employees in other forms of transit. He was the President of the TWU for the first thirty years of its existence. He was associated with the Communist Party for the first twelve years of his leadership of the union. He broke with them in 1948 because of their efforts to control the union rather than help the members. Quill educated himself on labor history in particular the works of James Connolly, The name that Quill and others chose for their new union was, in fact a tribute to the Irish Transport and General Workers Union led by Jim Larkin and Connolly twenty years earlier.

The union grew out of the tradition of Irish insurrectionary history of Connolly and the IRA. The IRT was, in fact filled with veterans of the recent troubles in Ireland, to the point that some jokingly referred to it as the "Irish Republican Transit". All of the founding members of the TWU belonged to the Clan na Gael, an Irish Organization, and the first discussions of forming a union took place across the street from the Clan na Gael's meeting place.

Quill had varying relations with the mayors of New York City. He was a personal friend of Robert Wagner. At the end of contracts Quill would always threaten to strike at the stroke of midnight on January 1, but always managed to settle the strike on each occasion. Quill could find no common ground with Wagner's successor, John Lindsay, or as Quill called him "Linsley", a liberal Protestant Republican who had rebuked Quill shortly before taking office in 1966. Lindsay decided to take on the TWU provoking a twelve-day transit strike in 1966. The City obtained an injunction prohibiting the strike and succeeded in imprisoning Quill. Quill did not waver, responding at a crowded press conference "The judge can drop dead in his black robes". However, he won significant wage increases for his members. He died of a heart attack three days after the end of the strike. He is interred at the Gate of Heaven Cemetery in Hawthorne, New York. Because of the success of the TWU in collective bargaining other city unions followed suit demanding similar raises.
